LAW OF MARYLAND.

STATE DEPARTMENT.

Annapolis, April 14th, 1838.

IN pursuance of authority contained in an act of the House of Delegates, thereby directing the acts of Assembly passed at December Session, 1835, entitled "an act to amend the Constitution and form of Government of the State of Maryland," chapter 197, and the act passed at the same session, entitled "an act providing for the appointment of clerks of the several County Courts, the Clerk of the Courts of Appeals for the Eastern and Western Shores, the Clerk of the Baltimore City Court, and the Register of Wills in the several counties of this State," chapter 224, and confirmed at the subsequent session, to be published each a week for three weeks successively on the following papers, to-wit: the *Frederick News*, the *Frederick Republican* and Gazette, Annapolis, Patriot, Chronicle, American, Transcript and Sun, Baltimore, and in all the papers published in the several counties of the State.

CHAPTER 224.

An act providing for the appointment of Clerks of the several County Courts, the Clerk of the Courts of Appeals for the Eastern and Western Shores, the Clerk of Baltimore City Court, and the Register of Wills in the several counties of this State.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That from and after the confirmation of this act, the Governor shall nominate, and by and with the advice and consent of the Senate, shall appoint the clerks of the several County Courts, the clerk of the Courts of Appeals for the Eastern Shore, the clerk of the Baltimore City Court, and the Register of Wills in the several counties of this State.

SECTION 2. And be it enacted, That the persons so appointed shall continue in office for and during the term of seven years, from the date of their respective appointments; provided nevertheless, that the persons who shall respectively be in office at the time of the confirmation of this act, shall be appointed for a term of five years, as clerks of the County Courts, as clerks of the Court of Appeals, as clerks of the Baltimore City Court, and as registers of Wills, shall not be subject in any respect to the operation of this act, until from and after the first day of January, in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and forty-five.

SECTION 3. And be it enacted, That if this act shall be confirmed by the General Assembly, after the next election of delegates, in the first session after such new election, as the constitution and form of government directs, that in such case this act and the alterations therein contained shall be considered as a part of the constitution and form of government, and all intents and purposes, any thing therein contained to the contrary notwithstanding.

CHAPTER 197.

An act to amend the Constitution and Form of Government of the State of Maryland.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the term of office of the members of the present Senate shall end and be determined whenever, and as soon as a new Senate shall be elected, as the members shall have qualified as directed by the constitution and laws of this State.

SECTION 2. And be it enacted, That at the December session of the General Assembly for the year of our Lord, eighteen hundred and thirty-eight, and at every subsequent session, the Senate shall be composed of twenty-one members, to be chosen as hereinafter provided, a majority of whom shall be a quorum for the transaction of business.

SECTION 3. And be it enacted, That at the time and place of holding elections in the several counties of this State, and in the City of Baltimore, for delegates to the General Assembly for the December session of the year eighteen hundred and thirty-eight, and under the direction of the same judges by whom such elections for delegates shall be held, an election shall also be held in each of the several counties of this State and in the City of Baltimore, respectively, for the purpose of choosing a senator of the State of Maryland for and from such county or said city, as the case may be, whose term of office shall commence on the day fixed by law for the commencement of the regular session of the General Assembly, and continue for two, four or six years according to the classification of a quorum of its members; and at every such election for senators, every person qualified to vote at the place at which he shall vote for delegates to the General Assembly, shall be entitled to vote for one person as senator; and of the persons voted for senator in each of the several counties and in said city, respectively, the person having the highest number of legal votes, and possessing the qualifications hereinafter directed, shall be declared and returned as duly elected for said county or said city, as the case may

be; and in case two persons possessing the required qualifications shall be found on the final casting of the votes given, in any one of said counties or said city, to have an equal number of votes, there shall be a new election to be held hereafter mentioned; and immediately after the election shall have commenced in pursuance of their election under this act, the senators shall be divided in such manner as the Senate shall prescribe, into three classes, the seats of the members of the first class shall be vacated at the expiration of the second year, of the second class at the expiration of the fourth year, and of the third class at the expiration of the sixth year, so that one-third thereof may be elected on the first Wednesday of October in every second year, and elections shall be held in the several counties and city, from which the retiring senators come, to supply the vacancies as they may occur in consequence of this classification.

SECTION 4. And be it enacted, That such election for senators shall be conducted, and the returns thereof made, with proper variations in the certificate to suit the case, in like manner as in cases of elections of delegates.

SECTION 5. And be it enacted, That the qualifications necessary in a senator shall be the same as are required in a delegate to the General Assembly, with the additional qualification that he shall be above age of twenty-five years, and shall have resided at least three years, next preceding his election, in the county or city in and for which he shall be chosen.

SECTION 6. And be it enacted, That in case any person who shall have been chosen as a senator, shall refuse to act, remove from the county or city, as the case may be, for which he shall have been elected, or resign, or be removed for cause, or in case of a tie between two or more qualified persons in any one of the counties, or the City of Baltimore, a warrant of election shall be issued by the President of the Senate for the time being, for the election of a senator to apply the vacancy, of which ten days notice at the least, excluding the day of notice and the day of election shall be given.

SECTION 7. And be it enacted, That so much of the thirty-seventh article of the constitution as provides that no senator or delegate to the General Assembly, if he shall qualify as such, shall hold or exercise any office during the time for which he shall be elected, shall be and the same is hereby repealed.

SECTION 8. And be it enacted, That no senator or delegate to the General Assembly, shall during the time for which he was elected, be appointed to any civil office under the constitution and laws of this State, which shall have been created, or the emoluments thereof shall have been increased during such time; and no senator or delegate, during the time he shall continue to act as such, shall be eligible to any civil office whatever.

SECTION 9. And be it enacted, That at the election for delegates to the General Assembly, for the December session of the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and thirty-eight, and at each succeeding election for delegates, until after the next election, shall have been taken and officially promulgated, and the members of the Senate for Baltimore city, and one delegate in and for the City of Annapolis, until the promulgation of the census for the year eighteen hundred and forty, when the City of Annapolis shall be deemed and taken as part of Anne Arundel county, and her right to a separate delegation shall cease; five delegates in and for Frederick county, and four delegates in and for Anne Arundel county, and four delegates in and for each of the several counties respectively, hereinafter mentioned, to-wit: Dorchester, Somerset, Worcester, Prince George's, Harford, Montgomery, Carroll and Washington, and three delegates in and for each of the several counties respectively, to-wit: Cecil, Kent, Queen Anne's, Caroline, Talbot, Saint Mary's, Charles, Calvert and Allegany.

SECTION 10. And be it enacted, That from and after the period when the next census shall have been taken and officially promulgated, and from and after the official promulgation of every second census thereafter, the representation in the House of Delegates from the several counties, and from the City of Baltimore, shall be graduated and established on the following basis, that is to say, every county which shall have by the said census a population of less than fifteen thousand souls, federal numbers, shall be entitled to elect four delegates; and every county having a population by the said census of fifteen thousand souls, and less than twenty-five thousand souls, federal numbers, shall be entitled to elect four delegates; and every county having by the said census a population of twenty-five thousand, and less than thirty-five thousand souls, federal numbers, shall be entitled to elect five delegates; and every county having a population of thirty-five thousand, and less than forty-five thousand souls, federal numbers, shall be entitled to elect six delegates; and every county having a population of forty-five thousand, and less than fifty-five thousand souls, federal numbers, shall be entitled to elect seven delegates; and every county having a population of fifty-five thousand, and less than sixty-five thousand souls, federal numbers, shall be entitled to elect eight delegates; and every county having a population of sixty-five thousand, and less than seventy-five thousand souls, federal numbers, shall be entitled to elect nine delegates; and every county having a population of seventy-five thousand, and less than eighty-five thousand souls, federal numbers, shall be entitled to elect ten delegates; and every county having a population of eighty-five thousand, and less than ninety-five thousand souls, federal numbers, shall be entitled to elect eleven delegates; and every county having a population of ninety-five thousand, and less than one hundred thousand souls, federal numbers, shall be entitled to elect twelve delegates; and every county having a population of one hundred thousand, and less than one hundred and fifty thousand souls, federal numbers, shall be entitled to elect thirteen delegates; and every county having a population of one hundred and fifty thousand, and less than two hundred thousand souls, federal numbers, shall be entitled to elect fourteen delegates; and every county having a population of two hundred thousand, and less than two hundred and fifty thousand souls, federal numbers, shall be entitled to elect fifteen delegates; and every county having a population of two hundred and fifty thousand, and less than three hundred thousand souls, federal numbers, shall be entitled to elect sixteen delegates; and every county having a population of three hundred thousand, and less than three hundred and fifty thousand souls, federal numbers, shall be entitled to elect seventeen delegates; and every county having a population of three hundred and fifty thousand, and less than four hundred thousand souls, federal numbers, shall be entitled to elect eighteen delegates; and every county having a population of four hundred thousand, and less than four hundred and fifty thousand souls, federal numbers, shall be entitled to elect nineteen delegates; and every county having a population of four hundred and fifty thousand, and less than five hundred thousand souls, federal numbers, shall be entitled to elect twenty delegates; and every county having a population of five hundred thousand, and less than five hundred and fifty thousand souls, federal numbers, shall be entitled to elect twenty-one delegates; and every county having a population of five hundred and fifty thousand, and less than six hundred thousand souls, federal numbers, shall be entitled to elect twenty-two delegates; and every county having a population of six hundred thousand, and less than six hundred and fifty thousand souls, federal numbers, shall be entitled to elect twenty-three delegates; and every county having a population of six hundred and fifty thousand, and less than seven hundred thousand souls, federal numbers, shall be entitled to elect twenty-four delegates; and every county having a population of seven hundred thousand, and less than seven hundred and fifty thousand souls, federal numbers, shall be entitled to elect twenty-five delegates; and every county having a population of seven hundred and fifty thousand, and less than eight hundred thousand souls, federal numbers, shall be entitled to elect twenty-six delegates; and every county having a population of eight hundred thousand, and less than eight hundred and fifty thousand souls, federal numbers, shall be entitled to elect twenty-seven delegates; and every county having a population of eight hundred and fifty thousand, and less than nine hundred thousand souls, federal numbers, shall be entitled to elect twenty-eight delegates; and every county having a population of nine hundred thousand, and less than nine hundred and fifty thousand souls, federal numbers, shall be entitled to elect twenty-nine delegates; and every county having a population of nine hundred and fifty thousand, and less than one million souls, federal numbers, shall be entitled to elect thirty delegates; and every county having a population of one million, and less than one million and five hundred thousand souls, federal numbers, shall be entitled to elect thirty-one delegates; and every county having a population of one million and five hundred thousand, and less than two million souls, federal numbers, shall be entitled to elect thirty-two delegates; and every county having a population of two million, and less than two million and five hundred thousand souls, federal numbers, shall be entitled to elect thirty-three delegates; and every county having a population of two million and five hundred thousand, and less than three million souls, federal numbers, shall be entitled to elect thirty-four delegates; and every county having a population of three million, and less than three million and five hundred thousand souls, federal numbers, shall be entitled to elect thirty-five delegates; and every county having a population of three million and five hundred thousand, and less than four million souls, federal numbers, shall be entitled to elect thirty-six delegates; and every county having a population of four million, and less than four million and five hundred thousand souls, federal numbers, shall be entitled to elect thirty-seven delegates; and every county having a population of four million and five hundred thousand, and less than five million souls, federal numbers, shall be entitled to elect thirty-eight delegates; and every county having a population of five million, and less than five million and five hundred thousand souls, federal numbers, shall be entitled to elect thirty-nine delegates; and every county having a population of five million and five hundred thousand, and less than six million souls, federal numbers, shall be entitled to elect forty delegates; and every county having a population of six million, and less than six million and five hundred thousand souls, federal numbers, shall be entitled to elect forty-one delegates; and every county having a population of six million and five hundred thousand, and less than seven million souls, federal numbers, shall be entitled to elect forty-two delegates; and every county having a population of seven million, and less than seven million and five hundred thousand souls, federal numbers, shall be entitled to elect forty-three delegates; and every county having a population of seven million and five hundred thousand, and less than eight million souls, federal numbers, shall be entitled to elect forty-four delegates; and every county having a population of eight million, and less than eight million and five hundred thousand souls, federal numbers, shall be entitled to elect forty-five delegates; and every county having a population of eight million and five hundred thousand, and less than nine million souls, federal numbers, shall be entitled to elect forty-six delegates; and every county having a population of nine million, and less than nine million and five hundred thousand souls, federal numbers, shall be entitled to elect forty-seven delegates; and every county having a population of nine million and five hundred thousand, and less than ten million souls, federal numbers, shall be entitled to elect forty-eight delegates; and every county having a population of ten million, and less than ten million and five hundred thousand souls, federal numbers, shall be entitled to elect forty-nine delegates; and every county having a population of ten million and five hundred thousand, and less than eleven million souls, federal numbers, shall be entitled to elect fifty delegates; and every county having a population of eleven million, and less than eleven million and five hundred thousand souls, federal numbers, shall be entitled to elect fifty-one delegates; and every county having a population of eleven million and five hundred thousand, and less than twelve million souls, federal numbers, shall be entitled to elect fifty-two delegates; and every county having a population of twelve million, and less than twelve million and five hundred thousand souls, federal numbers, shall be entitled to elect fifty-three delegates; and every county having a population of twelve million and five hundred thousand, and less than thirteen million souls, federal numbers, shall be entitled to elect fifty-four delegates; and every county having a population of thirteen million, and less than thirteen million and five hundred thousand souls, federal numbers, shall be entitled to elect fifty-five delegates; and every county having a population of thirteen million and five hundred thousand, and less than fourteen million souls, federal numbers, shall be entitled to elect fifty-six delegates; and every county having a population of fourteen million, and less than fourteen million and five hundred thousand souls, federal numbers, shall be entitled to elect fifty-seven delegates;
